### **Communication and Language**

#### As listeners and speakers this half term we will be:

Using our communication superpower to sequence pictures to help us to retell entire familiar stories to our adults and our friends in our play. Using our curiosity superpower to ask and answer open ended or speculative questions in our whole and small group activities.

Using our collaboration superpower to teach new skills to others using our words, new vocabulary and by showing others how we would do it. Remember and define special words we have learned over the new term and use them in our work and play.

#### **Physical Development**

#### As we develop our gross and fine motor skills this half term we will be:

 $Using woodwork tools \ safely \ under \ supervision \ to \ make \ flower \ boxes \ for \ planting \ our \ spring \ bulbs \ and \ bird \ boxes \ for \ our \ foundation \ garden.$

# Understanding the World As world understander's this half term we will be:

Interpreting Google Earth Street view of the route between school and Wallsend library. We will learn to name features of a map. Looking at similarities and differences between four-year-olds and adults. Describe how people grow up and change. Talking about the roles of significant adults in our community. Sequencing the life of a baby bird from hatching to maturity. Understanding the changes in seasons and talk about the changes to the environment in their community and visit the park to see the changes.

## Expressive Arts and Design

#### As artists this half term we will be:

Exploring colours of spring through the artist Claude Monet and experiment with colour mixing.

Use our communication superpower to speak and act in role play, recalling the jobs of key members of our community.

Drawing single or a sequence of pictures from the imagination to illustrate a story.

Use our Talk for Writing small world to verbally retell stories

Memorising short, choreographed dance sequences to accompany songs in pairs or groups.

Creating a very simple design of an emergency vehicle using 3D junk modelling shapes. We will use new vocabulary to talk about our toys.
