No previous experience is necessary but in terms of commitment, it would require the following:

- Attendance at THREE main meetings each year (4:30pm-7:00pm, one Monday each term)
- Attendance at THREE committee meetings each year (4:00pm-5:30pm, one school night each term)
- Attendance at TWO development sessions (two Saturday mornings from 9:30am-12:30pm)
- Assuming an area of responsibility which would require a minimum of ONE school visit per year

We are looking for people who are passionate about supporting and improving our school, who would strive to represent the varied interests of our parents and carers and who would have the best outcomes for all of our children at the heart of their role as a Richardson Dees governor. A wide range of training and support is available for the role.

Lyndsey was a part of our governing body for eight years and shared her thoughts on the role:

'I've just finished my 8th year as a parent governor whilst my two boys attended RDPS. Being a governor allows you to be involved in the running of the school behind the scenes. You provide support and challenge in order to make positive changes.
