## Week 1 & 2 Numbers, counting, pattern and quantity

#### **ELG CHILDREN COUNT RELIABLY WITH NUMBERS FROM 1-20**

- Recognise numerals 1-20
- Counts out up to 20 objects from a larger group
- Count actions or items that cannot be moved
- Select the correct numeral to represent 1to 20 objects
- Count objects to 20
- Counts an irregular arrangement of up to 20 objects.

## $\underline{\text{Week 3 \& 4}}$ Numbers: Composition and decomposition changing and comparing sets

ELG PLACE THEM IN ORDER AND SAY WHICH
NUMBER IS 1 MORE OR LESS THAN A GIVEN
NUMBER. USING QUANTITIES AND OBJECTS, THEY
ADD AND SUBTRACT TWO SINGLE DIGIT NUMBERS
AND COUNT ON OR BACK TO FIND THE ANSWER

- Use the language of more and fewer to compare two sets of objects
- Find the total number in two amounts by counting all of them
- Say the number which is one more.
- Finds one more or less from a group of up to 20 objects
- In practical activities and discussions, begin to use the vocab involved in adding and subtracting
- Estimate how many objects they can see and checks by counting them
